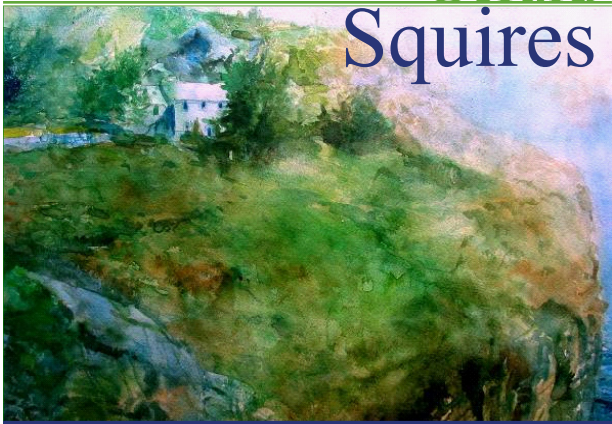

About Kent Cottage at Landfall

Built in the late 1700s or early 1800s, the cottage is one of the last remaining structures of its vintage in the province and is of substantial historical significance. It has been designated a Registered Heritage Structure. During 1914-15, the cottage was occupied by acclaimed American artist and writer, Rockwell Kent, whose subsequent fame brought considerable attention and notoriety to the property. In the 1930s A.E. Harris, an engineer and gifted artist, owned the property and named it Kent Cottage after his native county, Kent, in the UK. In 1953, the property was purchased by Bradley J. (Jake) Folensbee of Seattle, USA, and renamed Landfall. Jake was a dedicated educator, artist, photographer and writer, and invested considerably in Landfall's preservation. Subsequent to Jake's death in 2004, the Landfall Trust was established to ensure the preservation of Landfall in perpetuity.

Gerald Squires

A painter, sculptor, printmaker, art activist and teacher, Gerald Squires' large body of work is inspired by the landscape and culture of Newfoundland. His work has been included in numerous juried exhibitions in Canada, Great Britain, the United States, France and India. Corporate and public collectors of his works include Hibernia Management & Development Ltd; The National Library, Ottawa; The Permanent collection of the Rooms Provincial Art Gallery, St John's and the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts. Squires has received many honours including the Saidye & Samuel Bronfman 'Best Young Artist Award' (1965); The Canada Council for the Arts "B" Award (1987); an honorary degree from Memorial University of Newfoundland (1992); the Order of Canada (1999); member of the Royal Canadian Academy of Arts (1999). His most recent exhibition, "Gerald Squires: My Landscape" was held in Waterford, Ireland, in September, 2008.
